GENEVA, NEW YORK, 12 May 2019- Alarmed by new figures that say one in six children work in slave like forms of forced labour, UNICEF today called on all governments to move immediately and decisively to end the disturbing Phenomenon. The announcement comes in response to an important report which was made today by the International Labour Organization that says 246 million children between age 5 and 17 are working today.

In the normal lives of families with steady and adequate incomes, parents go to work every day and children are left to play with friends and go to school. However, such is not the case for child labourers who daily find themselves working long hours under harsh, dangerous and exploitative conditions. Globally the majority of working children come from the poorer sections of society. Social exclusion and poverty are important factors that keep them out of school and compel them to work.

"That so many children should be forced to work and endure the hardship and abuse that so often comes with it is more than unacceptable. These children need to spend time learning and developing not labouring in desperate attempt simply to survive," said Carol Bellamy Executive director of UNICEF "We need to see decisive leadership from governments banning such practices. And there is no better time to start taking this action than today, the very first World Child Labour Day".

Ending poverty and increasing access to education are therefore crucial tools for combating child labour and UNICEF uses education in 30 countries as both a preventive and protective measure against child labour.

Ernest Stuhlinger (Director of NASA Marshall space Flight Center in Hunts ville) "Large areas of land could be utilised far better if efficient methods of watershed control, fertiliser use, weather forecasting, (....) crop survey and harvest planning are applied.
